

2024 has been a period of stability and gentle growth for the NCT Centre. The pandemic is now well in the past, along with the emergency measures that were essential as a result.

The Newmains Community & Conference Centre has weathered the financial crisis and energy prices but has remained active in all the important areas of its remit – providing a meeting place for village activities, providing a social cafe with affordable prices, and a warm place in the winter for those that need it (along with the honesty trolley).

The Cafe has been doing well, due in large part to the skills of Martin, and we will continue to monitor the staffing levels to ensure it is both successful & sustainable. This is an ongoing task.

We will do whatever is necessary to ensure the continued success and viability of the Centre, keeping it as a valuable resource within Newmains. The aim of the NCT when it was created was to improve the Health & Well Being of the people of Newmains, and that is still the aim.

I would like to thank the staff and volunteers for their hard work in getting the Centre to where it is now, and our partners North Lanarkshire Council, NHS Lanarkshire and all the other organisations and grant funders who support the Trust.

I'd also like to thank Willie Hose in particular, who retired as Caretaker after nine years in the Centre. Willie was appointed in 2015 when the Centre opened.

Thank you once again for your hard work, dedication, and support.



Our Purpose



These events provide us with valuable opportunities to engage with the community, listen to their needs, and gain insights into how we can better serve them, and strengthening our bond with the community.



We launched several new services to integrate with and enhance our current offerings.

We were delighted to welcome back the Citizens Advice Bureau to the Centre. They now hold an open outreach service on the third Friday of each month, providing invaluable support to our community.

We have NLC Tackling poverty Team do outreach work each month, they offer opportunities, support, advice and information that will address the main drivers of poverty.

In collaboration with NHS Lanarkshire, we introduced the 'Near Me' service. This initiative facilitates easier access for our community members to attend pre-arranged appointments with their health professionals. Individuals can utilize a laptop and a private space within the Centre for their consultations.

In partnership with Cairney Cycles, we launched 'Newmains on Wheels', our new Cycling Activity Development for the benefit of Newmains community.





Our community, led by our Social Group and The Woodland Clean Up Group, played a crucial role in preparing our community garden areas for the spring and summer seasons. Their hard work and dedication have truly paid off, as evidenced by the beautiful gardens showcased in the photos.

The thriving herb and vegetable gardens are a testament to the collective effort and care of our Social Group. These gardens not only enhance the aesthetic appeal of our outdoor spaces but also provide practical benefits. The fresh herbs and vegetables are used in our community café, ensuring that our meals are both delicious and locally sourced. Additionally, these fresh produce items are available for community members to take home, promoting healthy eating and self-sufficiency.



Our 'Thursday Club' social group enjoyed some wonderful trips out this year, including the Riverside Museum, Kelvingrove and Callander House.

They were often joined by some of our friends from Beechwood Care Home. These outings exemplifies our commitment to fostering strong community partnerships and ensuring that our services and activities are as inclusive as possible.





Our weekly art class has been thriving this year, thanks to the incredible support of our talented artist, Helen Porter. Helen's expertise and enthusiasm have truly brought our sessions to life, inspiring creativity and joy in all participants.

Each week, we are delighted to welcome our friends from Beachwood Care Home, and we love seeing the unique and beautiful art projects everyone creates.



Thanks to the Orchard Project, we now have a thriving orchard that serves as a hands-on training tool for the practical aspects of the course. This collaboration has not only enhanced our educational offerings but also contributed significantly to our local environment and habitat. The orchard provides a sustainable green space that supports biodiversity and offers a habitat for various wildlife.

eBike rental scheme up and running with 13 ebikes in our fleet

Weekly Strathy Park ride have regular attendance and serve as a great exposure for our activities, the toddler trike is very popular. To date, we've help 170+ unique individuals get active in the saddle

We have welcomed two additional colleagues Graham and Ava to support the project. We have completed several Park Tool School education classes.

We will be starting afterschool cycle clubs from October in partnership with the local primary schools.

We have been working with Motherwell FC on their Pedal to the Pitch project.



We were honored to be the first charity to be awarded in the North Lanarkshire Councils Employer Charter accreditation.

We were awarded Silver in recognition after satisfying three of the four pillars of the Employer Charter:

Fair Pay – all paid members of staff are paid at least the real living wage;

Employ North Lanarkshire – We are in regular contact with the council's Employability Team when they have any recruitment needs, we offer a range of volunteering opportunities to the local community and regularly engage with local schools;

Buy North Lanarkshire – We support other local businesses, where possible.




We were thrilled to plant our own living Christmas tree at the front of the building. Unlike cut trees, our living tree will continue to flourish year after year.

The event featured a variety of activities, including arts and crafts, messy play, and a wide selection of books for the children to enjoy.

This service allowed parents and caregivers the opportunity to build a supportive network and foster creativity and social interaction, events like these contribute to the overall well-being and growth of our youngest community members.



Our caretaker, Willie, retired this year. Having started in 2015, Willie was our longest-serving staff member.

We extend our heartfelt thanks for all his hard work and dedication in keeping this place running smoothly and bringing smiles to our faces over the past nine years!



In partnership with NLC and led by our volunteers, we served as an anchor organization for the Period Dignity project.

This role enables us to discreetly provide products and raise awareness about how and where to access period products/services.

Our goal is to ensure that everyone can access these services with dignity and ease in a friendly, welcoming environment.

To date:

 Individuals have collected 42 orders directly from the centre.

• We made 99 deliveries of both single-use and reusable products to homes in Pather, Greenhead, Coldness, Wishaw South, and Newmains.
